2014 Highlights

Programming

BOOKIN' IT, a bimonthly book discussion group, has been added to the library's adult programming calendar. Along with the popular SE*ED and Bucket courses offered by Grinnell Regional Medical Center and the Community Education Council, these programs provide an opportunity for community building through the sharing of ideas and opinions.

PHPP

The Poweshiek History Preservation Project, a collaboration between DCL and Grinnell College libraries, has become a rich resource of local history. Photographs of rural school and Grange activities from the 1950s, submitted by a person who now lives in Kentucky, are just one example of PHPP content. Childrens and Youth Services

Our youth continue to choose DCL as an afterschool destination. Programming includes Storytimes each week and monthly on Saturdays. Afterschool programs include community presenters and a LEGO Club.

The largest program attendance occurred during the annual Summer Library Program, with 170 patrons learning about animals with the Blank Park Zoo.

Registered SLP participants read a total of 3,668 hours and turned in 613 reading logs/cards!

2014 Highlights, cont'd

Facility Improvement

Work began in April 2014 on the library's humidity control and energy recovery ventilation systems. Delays in procuring a crucial electronic component of the system stalled the project and work is expected to be completed in October 2014.

Gifts and grants were received from the Community Education Council, GRMC, and a Grinnell College mini-grant allowing for the installation of a hearing loop system in the Caulkins Community Room and an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for the library. Library staff receive annual training in first aid, CPR, and AED use.

Converging Landscapes: A Capital Campaign for the Library's Urban Prairie was launched in June, 2014. In keeping with Grinnell's image as the "Jewel of the Prairie," the Library will be a gateway to the prairie by creating an attractive landscape of more traditional design on the streetscape while enhancing access to the prairie grassland on the south side of the building. Sustainable practices include permeable paving and a bioswale. Work will continue in the southeast portion of the site in spring 2015.

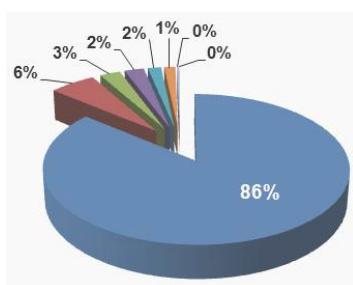

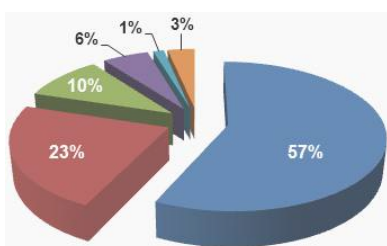
