### **2020/2021 Overview**

We started fiscal year '21 with a derecho and finished the year with the continuation of a global pandemic. Thankfully the City of Grinnell has withstood these pressures and the Library has been able to respond with modified and creative services to meet the needs of our community of library users. Increasing online engagement with virtual programming; curbside delivery; electronic books, magazines, and films; a revamped website; and Internet access through mobile hotspots have aided our community's resiliency.

Authoritative, science-based information is the best cure for health related questions. The Library fielded many inquiries regarding COVID vaccination availability and current pandemic conditions. Our library policies reflected best practices with respect to social distancing in order to keep staff safe while continuing public services.

### **Youth Department meets the challenge of the pandemic**

Pivot, transition, and flexibility describe our programming and services during the pandemic. While the building was closed to the public, online programming took place during the week with story times and special events on Saturdays. The special event programming was virtual and included stories and activities about world languages (French, Spanish, Arabic, and Hindi), feelings, kindness, being thankful and Halloween. Our programming was possible because of community members and community collaborations who graciously volunteered their time and talents.

Summer programming was a hybrid model with both virtual and in-person programming in collaboration with Tilly Woodward from the Grinnell College Museum of Art and AmeriCorps. Story Time Art in the Park was held twice a week at Grinnell College Museum of Art and the Farmer's Market at Central Park. Services were also provided for area summer camps and the school district's SLICK program.

Teens across Iowa including several from Grinnell participated in the Teen Battle of the Brains Smackdown. This was a virtual trivia event that was held on 3 separate occasions to give Iowa teens a chance to connect during online schooling last year.

### **Highlights from the Archives**

A collection of photos and memories of the Longhorn, a favorite Grinnell restaurant (1961-97), can now be viewed on the library's Local History website. The archive pamphlet file collection is now searchable online via Access to Memory, a collaborative local history database with Grinnell College. Archive materials were essential in renewed celebrations of Grinnellians Edith Renfrow Smith and Cornelia Clarke.

## Facility Management, FY21

The geothermal system received a major upgrade to the HTML interface used for remote monitoring as well as several new controllers and sensors to optimize operations. The derecho further damaged the already compromised large Maple tree south of the Library, necessitating its removal. In the fall, two Bur Oaks were planted to replace the Maple tree. Assorted shrubs, pines, and crabapple trees were planted on the south side of the parking lot to provide a green border.

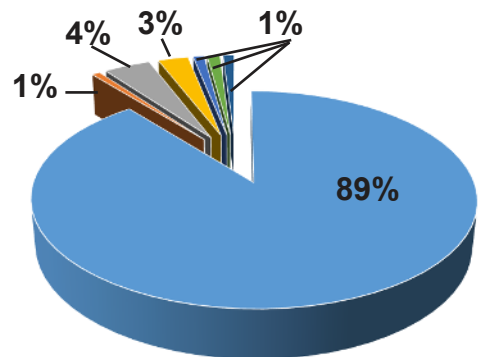
## Stay Cool & Read A Lot

Due to library closure mid-March thru May and the limitations of curbside delivery from June thru mid-August, library statistics have suffered. However, DCL cardholders have access to an excellent array of digital resources courtesy of Friends of Drake Community Library. This has proven to be a lifesaver during the pandemic. Usage of digital books, films, and informational databases increased an average of 30% when compared to "normal" times. 10,446 individuals hold library cards at DCL for an average of 6,311 library visits per month prior to the Coronavirus library closures. The numbers below give you a statistical glimpse of library usage throughout FY2021.
